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Motus by Scavolini: the kitchen as a space of open relationships



Motus reformulates the concept of a kitchen, mixing two styles together to create a new design. Typical of the 1950s, distinct task areas are arranged to suit the space, with a central cooking area and units that can be moved around over time. In addition, Motus investigates and perfectly interprets the social role of the contemporary kitchen: No longer is it only a place dedicated to food, but rather it serves as a multitasking space, an intimate meeting place for the family and at the same time, a room dedicated to relationships and conviviality. This is the idea that is the starting point of Scavolini's new Motus system, designed by Vittoire Nioiu.



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
